Universal/Core Provision/Wave 1	
<p>Wave 1 provision (Quality First Teaching) is the provision that is universal for all students. The majority of students needs will be met through this provision. Targeted/Enhanced/Wave 2	
<p>Wave 2 (targeted) provision is additional, time-limited, normally in the form of small or group interventions to accelerate progress and enable students to work at age-related expectations. Wave 2 interventions are not primarily for students with SEND and students do not have to be on the Code of Practice in order to access these. These provisions will be put in place following careful analysis of progress data and / or teacher identification.</p>

Personalised/Specialist/Wave 3	
Wave 3 provision (individualised and targeted) describes deeper intervention offering a more personalised solution if Wave 2 has not worked. Children at wave 3 may have particular needs related to specific special need. Wave 3 is likely to draw on specialist advice. It aims to reduce gaps in attainment and facilitate greater access to Waves 1 or 2.
